OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY At the beginning of August you may have seen the news that raids were conducted by ICE officials in Morton, Mississippi that resulted in the arrest of nearly 680 possibly undocumented workers. These raids left the children of these workers alone and afraid. Since then nearly half of the workers have been released from custody, but are currently unable to work as they await their deportation hearings. This has left many families, especially children, in the lurch for basic supplies such as food and clothes. In an effort to fill this void, an organization called *We Care* that is affiliated with Morton United Methodist Church is stepping up. *We Care Mission* was established in 1995 by four area churches to serve people in the community needing food and clothing assistance. With the help of Morton UMC *We Care Mission* is now reaching out to those affected by the ICE raids. Scripture tells us to "Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers" (Romans 12:13). Therefore we at St. Paul UMC have decided to work with our siblings in Christ at *We Care Mission*. From September 8th through October 6th St. Paul UMC will be taking up donations to send to Morton UMC in Mississippi to help care for these families. We will be collecting monetary donations as well as gently used or new toy donations for the children of these families. Monetary donation checks can be made out to St. Paul UMC with "We Care" in the memo line and toys can be dropped off in the donation bin located in the fellowship hall.
